As of late this afternoon, we report that no members are without power in our 19 county service area. Members and the general public are still encouraged to remain on high alert as wintry weather is expected to continue throughout tomorrow and through the weekend.

Safety is always a priority for our co-op, especially during an outage. If you lose power and want to use a portable generator, make sure you use it in a well-ventilated area. Don't connect the generator to your home's electrical panel or fuse boxes. It may cause electricity to feed back into the power lines, which can endanger linemen and damage electric service facilities.
