2018 BRIGHT IDEAS WINNER **BETHELMORE**

Beth Elmore has been a teacher at Mill Creek Middle School for 20 years, and during that time she's inspired countless children and sparked their interest in the sciences. This past school year she took her classroom creativity a bit further by applying for a Bright Ideas grant from EnergyUnited. We sat down with Beth to discuss her plans for the classroom and how EnergyUnited is helping out.

What inspired you to apply for a Bright Ideas grant from EnergyUnited?

I went to a STEM conference with a group of fellow teachers and together, we decided to pursue a grant that would help to teach the energy component of the seventh-grade curriculum.

And what inspired your project, Watt's Up?

Energy is such a vital part of the STEM curriculum for NC seventh graders and I wanted my students to see all the work and challenges that go into generating the power that they use every day. The Watt's Up project gives classroom kits to students and tasks them with making models complete with trees, power stations, homes and other details. There's much more of a mental connection when they see the distances that electricity has to travel and the types of places that use it, instead of connecting copper and a battery to charge a light bulb.

How did the project impact your students, and how much of an impact do you envision it having on the community in the future?

The Watt's Up kits were put together this year and will be put into place next school year. They are going to have such a profound effect and we wouldn't otherwise have been able to implement them without the help from our grant. I also think this grant will encourage students to explore careers in electricity and to investigate additional sources of energy like wind and even solar. Receiving this grant has also helped me see how other subjects/teachers could use a grant in their classrooms.

How easy or difficult was it for you to apply for this grant?

It was very simple. I applied along with several other teachers and even made a "girl's night" out of it. We went to dinner, sat on the patio and knocked out each section together that night. I would tell anyone looking to apply

to go for it and to not be afraid because it has the potential to help you do something really innovative for your students and the future!

The upcoming election will begin on August 5, 2019, and will end September 6, 2019. We encourage you to check out our official 2019 Board of Directors Voting Guide so you can get to know the nominees before you vote. You will receive your voting guide along with your ballot. Electronic ballots will be emailed on August 5, 2019, if you have shared your email address with us. If we do not have your email address on file, a hard copy ballot will be mailed to you on Monday, August 5.
