ABOUT US

The EnergyUnited Foundation is a charitable organization created by EnergyUnited EMC and funded by the members of EnergyUnited through Operation Round-Up. Each month, members can 'round up' their bill to the next highest dollar and the funds go directly to Operation Round-Up. Funds are distributed to individuals and families who are suffering catastrophic, unusual or unexpected problems and are in grave need of assistance. The EnergyUnited Foundation has helped many individuals pay their electric bills so that they wouldn't be without power, made a rent or mortgage payment so they wouldn't be evicted--these are life changing moments that wouldn't be possible without the generosity of our members and nonprofits.

The EnergyUnited Foundation is managed by a board of directors comprised of 9 members representing EnergyUnited's 19 county service area. The board meets monthly to review all applications and determines which applications will be fully funded, partially funded, or not funded at all.



OPERATION ROUND-UP



At EnergyUnited, we make it easy for members who want to give something back to their community.

Developed and launched by Hardeeville, S.C.-based Palmetto Electric Cooperative in 1989, this "members helping members" program allows electric cooperative consumers to round up their monthly electric bills to the next whole dollar amount. The extra pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters then flow into a fund managed by individual electric cooperatives and used to assist worthy community organizations as well as fellow members who fall on hard times. Some 250 local electric co-ops nationwide currently run Operation Round-Up programs, which have raised more than \$100 million over the years.

Through our Operation Round-Up program founded in 1996, members can round up their monthly electric bills to the next dollar, with the difference going to the EnergyUnited Foundation. Monthly donations can range from a penny to 99 cents. On average, individual donations will be about \$6 a year.

The amount donated is indicated on a member's monthly electric bill. Annual contributions are shown on the member's January bill.

EnergyUnited Foundation Grant Program

Applications accepted throughout the year from individuals, families and non-profit organizations. Maximum dollar amount granted is \$2,500 for individuals and \$10,000 for households and/or non-profit organizations.

Heating Assistance Program

electric bills through
the Heating Assistance
Program. These members
are elderly, disabled,
unemployed or dealing

with a family crisis. The maximum amount that can be granted is \$400 during the time period of December 1 through April 30 each year.

Energy Assistance Program

Program. These

maximum amount funded is \$400 per applicant during the months of May through August each year.
