HEAT suggested a variety of updates that could be done to help us save, with full instructions for each project. Each set of instructions included the skill level, tools and materials needed to get started, as well as the cost-benefit of each project.

Julie and I sat down and decided on a few projects that would be easy to tackle over a few months. We decided that our first projects would be sealing air leaks in the attic and replacing our light bulbs with more energy efficient ones.

I had remembered seeing a link on EnergyUnited.com about a new online store, so I read a little more about it and realized that I could purchase new replacement LED light bulbs directly online from the EnergyUnited Energy Efficiency store. Best of all, the store offers free shipping!

After completing those two projects, we started to notice the impact it had on our monthly bill. Once another few months had passed, we revisited our HEAT suggestions and decided to make the switch to a tankless water heater. Based on the information provided about

These teachers have applied online for the annual Bright Ideas grant program, awarded since 1994 to teachers for innovative, classroom-based projects that would not otherwise be funded.

Cenda Wooten and Adrian Bustle have proposed creative and innovative projects for their students and been awarded a Bright Ideas grant from EnergyUnited three years in a row!



Adrian Bustle, a social studies teacher at North Iredell High School in Iredell–Statesville Schools, has received a cumulative total of \$1,766.08 in Bright Ideas grant money for his classroom over the last three years. Bustle titled this year's project "The Historical Reporter," proposing the hands-on opportunity for students to use video and audio recorders to report their own news stories and learn how bias can be introduced in that experience. "The idea behind the project is to bring lessons to life and develop skills that are important for future success," writes Bustle.

In addition to Wooten and Bustle, EnergyUnited awarded nearly 40 teachers from 11 of the 19 counties they serve with over \$40,000 in Bright Ideas education grants to fund innovative classroom learning projects, which will benefit over 12,000 students.

This year, through her project, "When the E in STEM is for English," she will test the reading comprehension and critical thinking skills of her freshman honors English students in a practical way through technological and entrepreneurial projects rather than book reports. "By creating instead of memorizing, students will actually learn the material," writes Wooten.

Applications are now being accepted for Sports Camp Scholarships. Elementary and middle school students can apply online by March 31, 2018.

Stay Warm and Save Money this Winter

Did you know that the average American household uses almost half of their annual energy bill for heating and cooling? The following tips will help you stay warm while lightening the load on your winter energy bills.

Install a smart thermostat

A smart thermostat can automatically adjust your heating system for optimal performance to save you money on your next bill. A number of models are available at a range of price points, so you're sure to find a smart thermostat that fits your budget. Programmable thermostats run at a lower price point and allow you to create a weekly schedule of temperatures, so the unit automatically reduces the temperature setting when you're away. Recent studies indicate that a smart thermostat can help most consumers save 10–12 percent on their home heating costs due to the energy saved while they're away.

Change your furnace filters

Dirty filters block air flow and make your heating system work harder. If it must work harder, it uses more energy and costs you more money. Be sure to check and change your air filters once a month during the heating season.

Double check your propane tank

Do you use propane to heat your home? If so, don't forget to ensure that your propane tank is full so you can stay warm and cozy in your home.
