The program makes it super easy for member-owners like you to round up your monthly electric bills to the next whole dollar amount. The extra pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters flow into a fund managed by the EnergyUnited Foundation and are used to assist worthy community organizations as well as fellow members who fall on hard times.



Originally from Ohio, Janice Laughlin (or "Ja-Ja" if you ask her grandchildren) has dedicated her life to serving others. She spent the first 20 years of her career helping troubled and disabled children, first as an advocate, then as a teacher. A desire for something new led her to Philadelphia, where she took to service in the sky as a flight attendant, and later Cornelius, where she purchased her dream home. "I loved it because it was everything I wanted," Janice says. "I worked hard all those years, and this was a special place for me."

In August of 2012, Janice was involved in an accident that left her unable to work. Months later, she was diagnosed with breast cancer. After five surgeries, chemo and radiation, medical expenses piled on and she risked losing her home. "It was devastating," Janice reflects. "I have always been someone who helps others, and I didn't know how to ask for help for myself." That's when the Ada Jenkins Center referred her to the EnergyUnited Foundation. "I was feeling very low, and the Foundation accepted my application," Janice says. "It gave me such hope—a belief in the goodness of others."

Today, Janice's cancer is in remission and she has a newfound appreciation for life. With help and encouragement from friends, family and EnergyUnited, she still lives in her dream home and has found work as a substitute teacher and in senior companion care.

"As soon as I'm able, I will be contributing to the Operation Round-Up program," Janice says. "I want to pay it forward. I want to help somebody the way this program has helped me and my family."
